Bio-Diesel from Algae

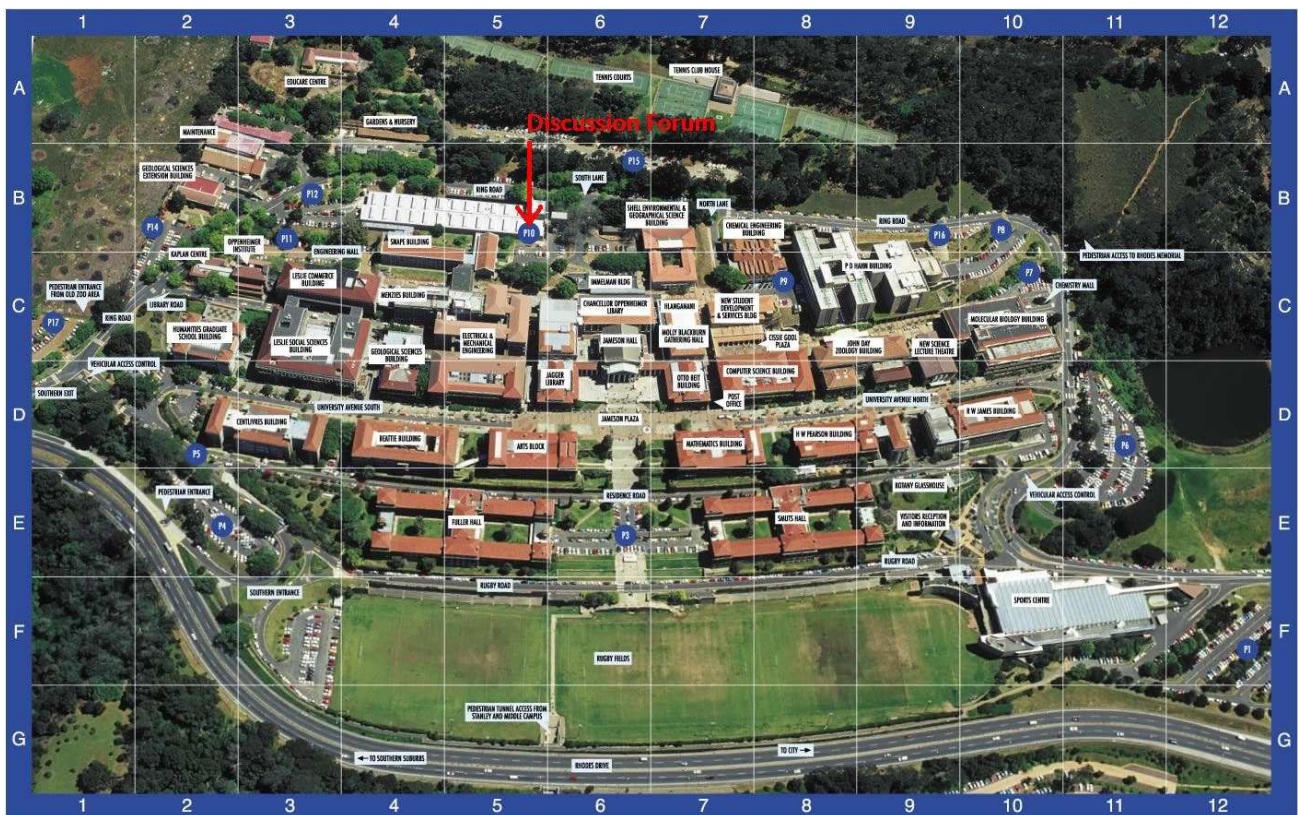

If parking is a problem, follow these steps - We do not have a map of the parking areas, but if you do the following, your chances of finding parking will be significantly advanced:

- 1) Go to the visitors' centre on arriving at UCT
- 2) Get a visitors' parking slip
- 3) Follow the Ring Road from the Visitors' Centre around the north side of campus (the side nearest central Cape Town)
- 4) When you reach the top part of Ring Road (looking down on the university), just after you passed the turn-off to the Chemical Engineering on the left, you will come to a sign pointing to the right, to the Tennis Club and the Daycare centre. Turn right.
- 5) Up this road (it goes steeply uphill), there are two parking areas which normally have vacancies on a Friday afternoon, and which visitors are permitted to park in (it says yellow disks only, but people with visitors' slips can park there too). The first one, to the right, is marked P15, and the second one, further up to the left, is marked P16.

Apart from this, apparently at this time visitors can park anywhere on campus you can find a spot (if you have a visitors' permit)
